Students' Satisfaction Survey :2019-20

Internal Quality Assurance Cell conducted Students' Satisfaction Survey in manual mode for the session 2019-20 in the college. Total 92 students participated in this exercise, in which 47 students and 45 students were from Arts and Commerce faculty respectively. The prescribed five-point scaling method was used for conducting survey. The scaling pattern from 4 to 0 is in descending order from higher to lower value. Table 1.1 shows the response of students on each attribute. :

Observations:

- 1. More than 25% of students reported that teachers are completed the syllabus of all courses while 48% of students reported that two-third of syllabus is completed by teachers.
- 2. More than 28% of students stated that teachers are very much prepared for the classes while 53% of students stated the preparation by teachers for the classes is satisfactory.
- 3 Around 46% of students cited that teachers always communicate effectively with students while 29% of students reported that communication with students is sometimes effective.

- 4. Around 35% of students mentioned that the approach of teachers towards teaching is excellent while 40% and 18% of students reported it as very good and good respectively.
- 5. Around 35 % of students stated that the internal evaluation conducted by teachers is always in fair environment while 40% of students reported it conducted in usually in fair environment.




Chart 1.1: Response of Students in Student Satisfaction Survey

- 6 More than 48% of students reported that teachers are always ready to discuss regarding assignments and performance while 25% feel that teachers usually discussed with students . 16% of students stated that teachers sometimes discussed with them.
- Nearly 53% of students reported that the college regularly promotes initiatives for students, while 19% students reported it as often. 21% of students expressed that college promote initiatives for students sometimes.
- 8. Around 39% of students cited that the college facilitates a significant teaching-mentoring process for all round development of students while 29% of students reported that it is very good process for all round development.

- 9. Around 35% of students strongly agreed about the provision of multiple opportunities to learn and grow, while 40% of students agreed about it.
- 10. Around 67% of students reported that teachers always inform students about expected competencies and learning outcomes while 16% of students reported they are usually informed about it.
- 11. More than 42% of students cited that teachers always follow-up about assigned task with students while 28% of students reported that it is done usually.
- 12. Nearly 50% of students reported that teachers always illustrated the concepts through giving examples and applications while 23% of students stated that it happens usually.
- 13. Around 41% of students cited that teachers fully identified the strengths of students and promoted encouragement by providing right level of challenges while 35% of students stated that teachers identified it reasonably.
- 14. About 50% of students feel that teachers identify their weakness, 22% students marked it as 'usually' and 15% students feel that it is done occasionly.
- 15. About 24% of students strongly agreed about continuous quality improvement of the teachinglearning process while 52% of students agreed about it.
- 16. Around 35% of students stated that the college used student centric methods to a great extent for enhancing learning experiences while51% of students reported it used moderately.
- 17. 39% of students strongly agreed about encouragement by teachers to participate in extra-curricular activities while 36% of students agreed to promotion by teachers about it.
- 18. Around 42% of students stated that efforts are made by the institution to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills for work to a great extent while 35% students marked it as moderate and 12% agreed with it to some degree.
- 19. About 37% of students reported that teachers frequently use of ICT during classroom teaching while 33% of students reported the use of ICT by teachers usually use ICT ,whereas 12% of students stated that use of ICT by teachers is low.
- 20. Around 50% of students strongly agreed about overall quality of teaching-learning process in the college is very good while 28% of the students agreed about it.

Suggestions for strengthening teaching-learning process

Students made following suggestions for for strengthening teaching-learning process . :

- Around 61% of students expected that teachers should be more aware about subject knowledge and up-gradation from time to time.
- Around 91% of students mentioned that teacher should apply intensive student centric methods and use of ICT for student's progression.
- More than 93% of students stated that career oriented programmes should be initiated by the college for promoting employability.
- Nearly 59% of students suggested that college should promote students to the participation of extra-curricular activities mainly sports activity.
- Students expected that college should take initiatives to organize internship, student exchange and field visit opportunities for students.
- > About 72% of students suggested that library services should be student centric.
- About 50% of students expressed their views that new courses for skill development are need of the hour.
